Summary

Mountain Sports is a collection of 7 winter sports that can be played by using the Wiimote and can also be controlled using the balance board. Balance board is encouraged to be used in a standing position for those sports such as snowboarding and skiing and prompts a sitting posture for sports such as bobsleigh, sledging and tubing. Whilst the variety of games is good and the use of the balance board is appealing the game on the whole doesn't match the graphics, sensitivity or realism that other games do, which is a drawback.

To use the Wiimote the player requires reasonable bilateral hand control and dexterity to be able to use the buttons on the right hand at least.

Ease of Navigation

The game is easy to navigate through with easy choices of winter games and difficulty level.

Therapeutic benefits / best qualities of the game

Offers the opportunity to work in a seated position with games that aren't found in other winter game packages. The use of the WiiMote with some of the games also offers the opportunity to explore dexterity and hand control with regards to co-ordination.

Limitations

The games are not as sensitive as they could be, therefore the controllers are not as responsive as with other games. This can be an advantage for those needing more time to work the controllers, but can also be a disadvantage as it means that not all movements created are replicated on the screen in a realistic manner.
